Riders, Owners, Lessees, Coaches and Trainers and legal guardians signing as coaches on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members of the USEF in good standing.

USDF numbers are required for the rider and owner. You can apply and pay for USDF membership at the show or pay the non-member fee of \$55.

Horses need USEF and USDF Life Membership or ID numbers. It is possible to apply and pay for USDF Horse Life or ID membership at the show.

*Note: Non-member, Show Pass and HID not required of those only in USDF Introductory classes or USEF Opportunity classes.

Stabling is very limited on the show grounds.

There is stabling available at nearby facilities. Please contact the secretary if you need a space for your horse. Expect to bring your own shavings and water bucket.

Management requests that all entries be created on Fox Village (<https://entry.foxvillage.com/>) If you wish to pay by check, you can print your online entry and mail it to the show secretary with the check. If you do not already have a user account with Fox Village, please sign up now. There is no charge to join Fox Village, create an entry or print an entry. Fox Village does charge a service fee. You may print and mail your entry. Entries missing documents and signatures are subject to additional fees. If you mail your entry and/or payment, please email the Show Secretary (juliet@riding.net or aliapm@alumni.stanford.edu) and let her know your entry is coming in the mail.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

Opportunity Classes:

All rules and regulations in GR821 must be followed. USEF GR821 non-member conditions apply if entered only in these classes. Horse, rider, owner, trainer do not have to be USEF, USDF, CDS members and do not have to pay non-member fees or USEF Drug fees. **Office fee, CDFA Drug fee, and Grounds/Stabling fees** do apply. Horses entered only in these classes are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing. Horses entered only in these classes:

- a. Are exempt from the Federation fee, including the Equine Drugs and Medication fee.
- b. Are not required to have a Horse Identification (HID) or Recording Number but are to list the HID or Recording number if the horse has been assigned this number.

Cross entry allowed but membership conditions will apply.

Opportunity Classes are not eligible for USEF/USDF End of Year Awards Programs.

Opportunity Classes DO COUNT toward CDS Qualifying, CDS End of Year Awards, CDS RAAC Qualifying, and JR Championships, if CDS membership is current when scores are earned.

Directions to the showgrounds:

FROM THE NORTH, Hwy. 101 south to Gilroy, exit E San Martin Ave and go east to New Ave and turn right, stay on through left and right turns, continue to Dancing Kings Farm on the right.

FROM THE SOUTH, Hwy. 101 north to Gilroy, exit at Leavesley Rd and go east to New Ave and turn left, continue to Dancing Kings Farm on the left.

SHOW RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

Federation Entry Agreement: By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representation, Employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation Inc and the local rules of the California Dressage Society. I agree to be bound by the bylaws and rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, agree to release and hold

harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/o the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcast, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport or the Federation. Those likeness shall not be used to advertise a product and may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4

SAFE SPORT REMINDER All USEF Life and Senior Active members as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirements. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules are in force from the moment the show management allows access to the show grounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.

SHOW MANAGEMENT reserves the right to cancel, combine, or divide classes, or to change officials as it deems necessary. The decision of the show management on all questions not covered by these rules or the US Equestrian Federation Rulebook is final.

ENTRY ACCEPTANCE: Entries will be accepted on a first-come basis and must include all fees, membership proofs, signatures, and payment. No numbers will be issued without completed entries, full payment, signatures, fees, and CURRENT copies of ALL registration cards.

All entries must be **postmarked, or time stamped** by the closing date listed in the prize list to be considered on time. Show management may close entries early if show fills prior to closing date. Entries submitted after the show is full will go on the wait list. Competitors will be advised of their entry status via an entry confirmation from Fox Village (confirmations@foxvillage.com).

Entries submitted that are not accepted will be returned and refunded in full.

Competitors are responsible for reading and responding to the entry confirmation. If entry confirmation is not received by the closing date of the show, the competitor is advised to contact the show secretary.

No Phone/FAX entries. Late entries accepted **online only** as space allows.

LATE ENTRIES: Entries postmarked after published closing date will be assessed a **\$40.00** late fee.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: All entries must include an emergency contact name and number for rider and any other mounted person.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: 1) **USEF Entry Agreement**, 2) **USEF Waiver** (both forms require signatures for everyone listed on the entry), 3) **Dancing Kings Farm release** and 4) **Current Flu/Rhino vaccination record** (see GR845).

These documents may be uploaded in Fox Village and submitted with the show entry or e-mailed separately to the Show Secretary. **Please make sure you have attached current USEF Entry and Waiver documents**

RETURNED CHECKS: A fee of **\$35.00** will be charged for all returned checks. Accounts will be given 10 days to be paid in full with cash or equivalent or they will be turned over to USEF for further disciplinary action.

REFUNDS/SCRATCHES: REFUND REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRITING AND SIGNED. Refunds for cancellations made prior to stated entry closing date will be made in full, less the \$38.00 office fee. After the entry closing date, no refunds of entry fees or stabling. No exceptions.

There will be no refunds of any sort (including but not limited to haul-in, drug, class, office, and association fees) for same day scratches or no shows. These fees will be considered a contribution to the show and your signature on the entry verifies that this is understood as a condition of entry. There will be no refund for a "no show" and later classes may be rescheduled with no notification to the "no show".

POST ENTRIES: Post entries will be accepted to fill scratches if the schedule permits. Horses already entered in the show will receive priority.

Copies of all membership cards are required. The membership requirements of USEF, USDF and CDS will be strictly followed and the show will collect nonmember fees for any individual or horse registration that is required and cannot be proven by presentation of the current card. To enter the Adult Amateur Division, the USEF Membership card **MUST** indicate Amateur, and the individual must reach the age of 22 in the current year. If you do not submit proof of Adult Amateur status, you will be entered in the Open division. If you request to switch to Adult Amateur classes after entry closing, all post entry and/or change fees will be applied.

You must also provide the **USEF Waiver and Release of Liability Form** for everyone listed on the entry. If bringing a groom, the Waiver is required. These Waivers may be uploaded in Fox Village and submitted with the show entry or e-mailed separately to the Show Secretary. Entries without current and correct association number verification will be considered incomplete and the membership verification fee applies for each entry.

Correct fees and association numbers **MUST ACCOMPANY EACH ENTRY FORM** or an **INCOMPLETE ENTRY FEE OF \$40.00** will be charged, no exceptions!

NON-MEMBER FEES: USEF non-member Show Pass must be purchased online at USEF.org and is available one-time only use. USDF non-member fee is \$55.00. These fees apply per show. **HID FEES:** USDF HID fee is \$55.00.

You must upgrade to a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration and a USEF Annual or Lifetime Horse Recording to participate in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships qualifying classes.

DAY USE FEE:

\$35.00 will be charged for all horses on the show grounds that are not stabled. This fee applies to any horse brought onto the grounds, even if the horse remains in the horse trailer or is ridden or led onto the grounds.

PARKING: Exhibitors may park cars, trucks, and trailers in designated areas only.

VET & FARRIER: On call. Phone numbers will be posted at the show office.

EMT: Qualified medical personnel are on the premises at all horse shows.

COMPETITION ARENA: Sand/rubber footing. Competition arena is: 110 x 205. Warm-up has similar footing.

CLOSED ARENAS: Horses are not permitted in competition arenas on a show day at any time other than scheduled riding times. Violation will be cause for elimination.

LONGEING: A 60' sand lunging area will be provided.

BRIDLE NUMBERS: The assigned bridle number must be worn at all times when the horse is out of the stall or trailer.

BITS AND BRIDLE CHECK: Exhibitors must present bridles and bits, when requested to the technical delegate for inspection utilizing the method, timeframe and location identified by competition management with the agreement of the TD. The method to be communicated to the competitors prior to the start of the competition.

WARM-UP ARENAS: Use of the warm-up arenas is limited to those who are entered in the show and, at the discretion of Show Management will be further restricted to those warming up for the class(es) in progress when there is congestion. **NO ONE ON FOOT WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE WARM-UP AREAS AT ANY TIME.** Longeing is only allowed in designated areas.

CONDITION OF ENTRY: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management and property owners will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its Directors and Employees, Dancing Kings Farm, Property Owners, and Employees harmless for any loss or accident to himself, his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold the property owners harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted unless a parent or guardian signs it. The signature of instructors, agents or other unrelated persons will not be acceptable. Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling, and location.

DOGS must be on a leash or otherwise contained at all times.

FOOD: on site.

CLASS SCHEDULE: Classes will be scheduled to accommodate the judge, riders, and management. Rider scheduling preferences, if noted on the entry, will be indulged when possible. The 50 minutes between rides rule will be observed. Requests for shorter breaks will be accommodated when logistically possible. Classes will not necessarily be scheduled in order of difficulty.

RIDE TIMES: Provisional ride times will be EMAILED and posted to Fox Village
(<https://www.foxvillage.com/Results>)

It is the obligation of the entrant to contact the Show Secretary at juliet@riding.net or **408 857 6240** if times have not been received.

Scheduling conflicts must be emailed to the Show Secretary at least 48 hours prior to the start of the show.

RIDERS SHOULD BE AWARE THAT IF THE NEED ARISES, THE SHOW MANAGEMENT CAN CHANGE RIDE TIMES AS PER USEF GR 830.

Each exhibitor is responsible to check the schedule. Final ride times will be available at Fox Village (<https://www.foxvillage.com/Results>). Please do not assume lower levels will be run first, as may be necessary to run classes out of order. Due to weather and other factors, upper levels may be scheduled earlier in the day than lower levels.

TESTS: Current USEF, FEI, USDF and Para Equestrian tests will be used.

SCORED TESTS will be given only to riders or their agents and only after the results are finalized and the class is placed. Any disputes concerning scores, divisions entered, and/or placings must be brought to the attention of the Show Office within one hour of the end of the show day. Scores and placings become final at that time.

FREESTYLES: Freestyle music must be in an mp3 file on a thumb drive. Please give to Show Secretary upon check-in on show day. Sound check will be held daily at the first break.

*Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Para-Equestrian Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of **63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition**, Federation Licensed or FEI recognized Dressage Competition, or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class.*

SHOW CANCELLATION: In the event of rain prior to the show, it is the responsibility of the rider to call the Management to determine whether the show is canceled. Shows are NOT canceled unless the footing is deemed unsafe. If the show is canceled for any reason, an office fee will be retained from each entry and the balance refunded.

PROTESTS: USEF General Rules, Chapter 6 define the protest procedure.

CDS MEMBERSHIP: CDS Membership is not required to participate in USEF/USDF recognized shows. However, if your goal is to qualify for the CDS Annual Championship show, CDS Junior Championships (North or South), or CDS RAAC Competitions (North, or South), or any CDS awards programs, the Rider and Owner must be members of CDS at the time the scores are earned. To ensure that your scores count for CDS Championships and other CDS events, be sure to include a copy of your card with your entry or join at the show.

JUNIORS: All minors/juniors must be always supervised by their parent/guardian or authorized agent while at or on the show grounds, whether riding or on foot. The parent/guardian or authorized agent shall assume all responsibility to protect juniors from any injury, damage, harm and/or loss and shall indemnify, defend and hold Show Management, its employees and volunteers, the facility at which the show is held, Dancing Kings Farm, and all affiliated organizations harmless therefrom.

EQUINE VACCINATION RULE GR845:

1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine

Herpes Virus (Rhino-pneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations, name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15.

BIO-SECURITY PROTOCOL: Please note—this show has a BIO-SECURITY PROTOCOL.

Show management must be notified if any vet is called to show grounds for any reason. Failure to notify show management may result in fine and/or being required to leave competition grounds. Any horse found to present a potential for transmittable disease will be required to leave competition grounds.

Bio-Security protocol does not negate the refund policy as outlined in this prize list.

SHARPS CONTAINERS: *GR1210.4* Competition management shall place a sharps container in the show office. **Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$150 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.**

HELMET RULE: *DR 120.6.* From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including noncompeting riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

WAIVING OF COATS: *DR 120 Dress.* In locations with high average heat and humidity on the date of a competition, management can publish in their prize list that jackets will be waived for the duration of the competition. Alternatively, management can announce prior to or during a competition that competitors can show without jackets when extreme heat and/or humidity is forecast. This waiver applies to all classes including FEI classes at National Competitions. However, competitors must wear protective headgear and a shirt with sleeves and collar, without neckwear, and without decoration.

Tshirts are not permitted. Members of the Armed Services or police units may wear summer uniforms. **For this show, the waiving of jackets will be a show day decision.**

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT:

In accordance with USEF *GR1301.7 and GR1301.8:* Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. ***The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.*** Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (GR1301.7)

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (GR1301)

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

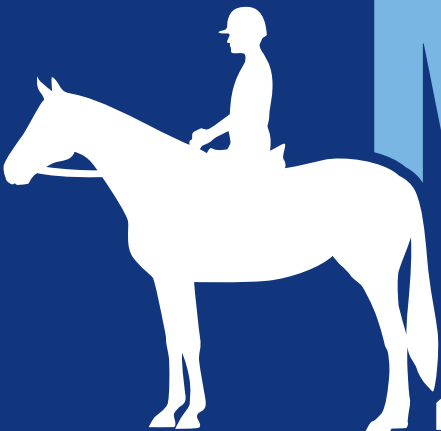

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Under the laws of most States, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D.
